- Explore animal breeds, animal restraint techniques, dairy shed operations and application of medicine (different routes) in goat animals.
- Observe animal behavior, including temperature, rumination, ecto-parasite presence, urination, defecation, and onset of heat.
- Demonstrate the cleaning techniques of animals.
- Demonstrations on fodder plot management, azolla pit utilization, hydroponic units, straw enrichment, home concentrate preparation, hay, and silage production.
- Familiarize with Artificial Insemination (AI) techniques and engage in discussions with successful farmers, SHGs, FPOs, etc.
- Allocate time for healthcare management, nutrition, breeding, record-keeping, institutional linkages (BLDO office, AHC, Bank, KVK, etc.), marketing, and miscellaneous activities.
- Trainees are required to brain-storm on the topic for 1 hour, and then make presentation. All members have to participate.
- Based on their presentations, their learning gaps may be identified and addressed accordingly.
- Each of the trainees is required to come up with their activity timeline (setting goal) as far their enterprise is concerned.

- All trainees would be encouraged to come up with their doubts whatsoever. All doubts are required to be cleared in this session.
- Based on their activity timeline (goal), long term follow up plan of the ARD Dept. will be shared with the trainees.
