Draft Revised Curriculum for Higher Secondary (Vocational)

This is for information to all the Heads of Institutions, teachers, instructors, students, guardians and other stakeholders of Higher Secondary (Vocational) courses running in Vocational Training Centers (VTCs) under West Bengal State Council of Technical and Vocational Education and Skill Development (WBSCTVESD) that this council has taken an initiative to revise the curriculum of Higher Secondary (Vocational) courses. The course curriculum was last revised in the year 2015. Suggestions / feedback had been received over the years from various stakeholders regarding some changes required in the existing course curriculum. An Advisory Committee has also been constituted for the said purpose. Now, after careful consideration of the suggestions received from different stakeholders and the members of the Advisory Committee and in line with the State Education Policy - 2023, A draft revised curriculum has been drawn as stated herein under which is now placed for further comments from all the stakeholders.

Salient features of the draft revised curriculum are detailed below:

A. Names of the Disciplines of Higher Secondary (Vocational) courses:

1. The names of the Disciplines remain unchanged as in the existing curriculum. Hence, there will be five disciplines named as, i) Agriculture (AG), ii) Business & Commerce (BC), iii) Engineering & Technology (ET), iv) Home Science (HS) and v) Healthcare Science (HC)

B. Names of the Groups under respective Disciplines of Higher Secondary (Vocational) courses:

• Discipline: Agriculture (AG)

1. In the Agriculture discipline, the 'Group' named "Cultivation of Fruits & Vegetable (AGCF)" will be merged with the already existing Group named "Horticulture (AGHC)".
2. The name of the 'Group' "Fish Farming(AGFF)" will be renamed as "Fisheries (AGFH)"
3. Hence, there will be five groups in AG discipline named as, i) Animal Husbandry (AGAH), ii) Fisheries (AGFH), iii) Crop Management (AGCM) , iv) Horticulture (AGHC) and v) Plant Management (AGPM)

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- **Discipline: Engineering & Technology (ET)**

4. All the Groups of Engineering & Technology discipline will remain unchanged as in the existing curriculum. Hence there will be eight groups in ET discipline named as, i) Building Construction Maintenance (ETBC), ii) Automobile Technology (ETAT), iii) Refrigeration & Air Conditioning (ETRA), iv) Renewable Energy (ETRE), v) IT Infrastructure and Application (ETIT), vi) Electrical Maintenance & Installation (ETEM), vii) Consumer Electronics (ETCE) and viii) AI - ML (Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning) (ETAM)

- **Discipline: Business & Commerce (BC)**

5. In the Business & Commerce discipline, groups named “Retail Service & Operations (BCRS)” and “Taxation & Management (BCTM)” will be discontinued. The other two groups of the Business & Commerce discipline will remain unchanged.
6. Two new groups will be introduced named, “Accounting & Finance (BCAF)” and “Retail Operations (BCRO).”
7. Hence, there will be four groups in Business & Commerce discipline named as, i) Library & Information Science (BCLS), ii) Travel, Tourism & Event Management (BCTE), iii) Accounting & Finance (BCAF) and iv) Retail Operations (BCRO).

- **Discipline: Home Science (HS)**

8. The group “Home Management (HSHM)” will be renamed as “Human Development And Resource Management (HSHR)”
9. Hence there will be two groups in Home Science discipline named as, i) Food and Nutrition (HSFN) and ii) Human Development And Resource Management (HSHR)

- **Discipline: Healthcare Science (HC)**

10. The Group of Healthcare Science discipline will remain unchanged. Hence there will be one group in Healthcare Science discipline named as, i) Community Healthcare (HCCH)

C. Academic Structure of Higher Secondary (Vocational) Course:

1. The Higher Secondary (Vocational) Course will consist of four parts, i.e. Semester I, Semester II, Semester III and Semester IV.
 - a) Class XI will consist of Semester I and Semester II, while Class XII will consist of Semester III and Semester IV.
 - b) The curriculum of the Semester I and Semester II (i.e. : Class XI) shall consist of:

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- (i) Two Language Papers to be chosen from the Language Group as mentioned in 'Table 1', one subject from 'Language 1' and the other from 'Language 2'.
- (ii) Two Basic Vocational Papers to be chosen from 'Table 2' for respective disciplines.
- (iii) Two Academic Elective Papers to be chosen from sets as mentioned in 'Table 4' for respective disciplines.
- (iv) One Optional Paper, if desired, may be chosen from the designated set from which two Academic Elective subjects have already been chosen.
- (v) Hence, in Semester I and Semester II (i.e.: Class XI), candidates will mandatorily choose six subjects (two Language Papers, two Basic Vocational Papers and two Academic Elective Papers). One Optional Elective Paper may or may not be opted. If opted, it should only be from the respective set of Academic Elective Papers. If such Optional Paper is opted, there will be seven subjects for which candidates will sit for the examinations of Semester I and Semester II (i.e.: Class XI). If such Optional Paper is not opted in Semester I and Semester II (i.e.: Class XI), candidates will not be permitted to opt Academic Elective Paper as Optional Elective Paper in Semester III and Semester IV (i.e.: Class XII)
- (vi) A candidate will be declared passed in Semester I and Semester II (i.e.: Class XI), if S/he obtains minimum thirty per centum marks independently in both the Language Papers, both the Basic Vocational Papers and any of the Academic Elective Papers (including the Optional Elective Paper).

c) The curriculum of the Semester III and Semester IV (i.e. : Class XII) shall consist of:

- (i) Two Language Papers to be chosen from the Language Group as mentioned in 'Table 5', one subject from 'Language 1' and the other from 'Language 2'. The choice of two Language Papers will remain the same as that of the opted Language Papers in Class XI.
- (ii) Two Vocational Papers to be chosen from any of the given sets of a particular 'Group' under respective discipline as mentioned in 'Table 6' for Agriculture discipline, 'Table 7' for Engineering & Technology discipline, 'Table 8' for Business & Commerce discipline, 'Table 9' for Home Science discipline and 'Table 10' for Healthcare Science discipline.
- (iii) Two Academic Elective Papers from any of the five sets as mentioned in 'Table 11' for respective disciplines, subject to other conditions specified in the Important Note mentioned below.

Important Note:

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- Two Academic Elective Papers of Semester III and Semester IV (i.e. : Class XII), will remain the same as that of the chosen two Academic Elective Papers of Semester I and Semester II (i.e. : Class XI), only if, minimum thirty per centum marks is secured independently in both the subjects. If one fails to secure minimum thirty per centum marks in any of the subjects, continuation of that subject in Semester III and Semester IV (i.e. : Class XII) will not be permitted.

(iv) One Optional Elective Paper, if desired, may be chosen from the designated set (as per Table 4) from which two Academic Elective Papers have already been chosen or from the designated set (Table 6 to table 10) from which two Vocational Papers have already been chosen, subject to other conditions specified in the Important Note mentioned below.

Important Note:

- Optional Elective Paper may or may not be opted in Semester III and Semester IV (i.e. : Class XII).
- If one desires to opt any of the Academic Elective Papers from the designated set as the Optional Paper in Semester III and Semester IV (i.e. : Class XII), it will only be permitted in the case where one has already opted the same paper in Semester I and Semester II (i.e. : Class XI) and has secured minimum thirty per centum marks in it. S/he will not be permitted to choose any new Academic Elective Paper in Semester III and Semester IV (i.e. : Class XII).
- One may opt any of the Vocational Papers from the designated set (Table 6 to table 10) as the Optional Paper in Semester III and Semester IV (i.e. : Class XII).

(v) A candidate will be declared passed in Semester III and Semester IV (i.e.: Class XII), if S/he obtains minimum thirty per centum marks independently in both the Language Papers, both the Vocational Papers and any of the Academic Elective Papers (including the Optional Paper which may be an Academic Elective Paper or a Vocational Paper in Semester III and Semester IV).

D. General Structure of Semester I and Semester II (i.e. Class XI):

1. In Semester I and Semester II (i.e. Class XI), there will be two Language Papers (Subject 1 and Subject 2), two Basic Vocational Papers (Subject 3 and Subject 4) and two/three Academic Elective papers (Subject 5, Subject 6 and Subject 7). “Subject 7” will be an Optional Paper which may or may not be opted. “Subject 1” and “Subject 2” will be termed as “Language 1” and “Language 2” respectively. “Subject 3” and “Subject 4” will be termed as “Basic Vocational Paper 1” (herein after referred as ‘BVP1’) and “Basic Vocational Paper 2” (herein after referred as ‘BVP2’) respectively. “Subject 5”, “Subject 6” and “Subject 7”{if opted}, will be termed as “Academic Elective 1” (herein after referred as ‘AE1’), “Academic Elective 2” (herein after referred as ‘AE2’) and

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“Academic Elective 3” (herein after referred as ‘AE3’) respectively. The general structure of Semester I and Semester II is shown in “Table 1”.

E. Language Papers (Subject 1 and Subject 2) of Semester I and Semester II (i.e. Class XI):

1. The choice of two language papers (Subject 1 and Subject 2) in Semester I and Semester II (i.e. Class XI) for all the disciplines will be as shown in Table 1.

F. Basic Vocational Papers (Subject 3 and Subject 4) of Semester I and Semester II (i.e. Class XI):

1. The Basic Vocational Papers i.e. ‘BVP1’ and ‘BVP2’ of all the five disciplines (AG, ET, BC, HS, HC) will have Employability Skills I (ES-I) and Employability Skills II (ES-II) respectively as one of their components. Employability Skills I (ES-I) will have the content of Enterprise Skills and Employability Skills II (ES-II) will have the content of Digital Skills. Thus existing common subject group i.e.: Entrepreneurship Development and Computer Application (EDCA) will be discontinued as a separate paper.
 - **Discipline: Agriculture (AG)**
 - 2. The two Basic Vocational Papers which will be taught in Semester I and Semester II in all the five ‘Groups’ of Agriculture Discipline are “Basic Agricultural Practices and Enterprise Skills (BAPE)” and “Basic Animal Husbandry and Digital Skills (BAHD)” to be treated as ‘BVP1’ and ‘BVP2’ respectively.
 - **Discipline: Engineering & Technology (ET)**

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3. In Engineering & Technology discipline, “Basic Applied Mechanics and Enterprise Skills” will be taught as ‘BVP1’ for all the ‘Groups’ of ET discipline in Semester I and Semester II. “Foundation of Technical Trades and Digital Skills” will be taught as ‘BVP2’ for respective Groups.

The choice of subjects for ‘BVP2’ will be different for different ‘Groups’ of ET discipline which are mentioned below.

- i) “Foundation Course on Civil and Digital Skills (FCWD)” for Building Construction Maintenance group
- ii) “Foundation Course on Mechanical & Automobile and Digital Skills (FAWD)” for Automobile Technology group
- iii) “Foundation course on Mechanical & Cooling System and Digital Skills (FMWD)” for Refrigeration & Air Conditioning group
- iv) “Foundation course on Renewable Energy and Digital Skills (FRWD)” for Renewable Energy group
- v) “Foundation course on Computer Hardware and Security and Digital Skills (FHWD)” for IT Infrastructure and Application group
- vi) “Foundation course on Electrical and Digital Skills (FEWD)” for Electrical Maintenance & Installation group
- vii) “Foundation course on Electronics and Digital Skills (FLWD)” for Consumer Electronics group
- viii) “Foundation course on AI-ML and Digital Skills (FIWD)” for AI - ML (Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning) group

4. The ‘BVP2’ papers of all the eight ‘Groups’ of Engineering & Technology discipline mentioned above, will have ‘Workshop’ as one of the components. Any two workshops are to be chosen from ‘House Wiring’ / ‘Fitting’ / ‘Welding’ / ‘Carpentry’ / ‘Electronics Workshop’.

- **Discipline: Business & Commerce (BC)**
- 5. Two distinct subjects will be introduced as ‘BVP1’ and ‘BVP2’ for Business & Commerce discipline which are i) “Basic Management Principles and Enterprise Skills (BMPE)” and ii) “Basic Accounting and Digital Skills (BADS)”

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- **Discipline: Home Science (HS)**

6. In Home Science discipline, there will be two Basic Vocational Papers which are i) Basic Lifestyle Management and Enterprise Skills (BLME) and ii) Basic Early Childhood Care and Digital Skills (BECD)

- **Discipline: Healthcare Science (HC)**

7. The two Basic Vocational Papers of Healthcare Science discipline will be same as HS discipline which are i) Basic Lifestyle Management and Enterprise Skills (BLME) and ii) Basic Early Childhood Care and Digital Skills (BECD)
8. The following 'Table -2' may be referred for details of Basic Vocational Papers of Semester I and Semester II (Class XI) of all the disciplines.

G. Academic Elective Papers (Subject 5, Subject 6 and Subject 7) of Semester I and Semester II (i.e. Class XI):

1. Basket of Academic Elective Papers will be offered for respective disciplines. Subject 5 and Subject 6, i.e. Academic Elective 1 (AE1) and Academic Elective 2 (AE2) will be compulsory academic papers. Subject 7, i.e. Academic Elective 3 (AE3) will be an optional paper which may or may not be opted.

• Discipline: Agriculture (AG)

2. The Academic Elective Papers in the basket of Agriculture discipline are mentioned below,
 - i) Biology, ii) Chemistry, iii) Physics, iv) Computer Application and v) Environmental Science OR Entrepreneurship.

• Discipline: Engineering & Technology (ET)

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3. The Academic Elective Papers in the basket of Engineering & Technology discipline are mentioned below,
i) Mathematics, ii) Chemistry, iii) Physics, iv) Computer Application and v) Environmental Science OR Entrepreneurship.

● **Discipline: Business & Commerce (BC)**

4. The Academic Elective Papers in the basket of Business & Commerce discipline are mentioned below,
i) Accountancy, ii) Business Law, iii) Economics and Business Math & Statistics, iv) Computer Application and v) Environmental Science OR Entrepreneurship.

● **Discipline: Home Science (HS)**

5. The Academic Elective Papers in the basket of Home Science discipline are mentioned below,
i) Dietetics, ii) Human Development, iii) Biology, iv) Chemistry, v) Computer Application and vi) Environmental Science OR Entrepreneurship.

● **Discipline: Healthcare Science (HC)**

6. The Academic Elective Papers in the basket of Healthcare Science discipline are mentioned below,
i) Dietetics, ii) Human Development, iii) Biology, iv) Chemistry, v) Computer Application and vi) Environmental Science OR Entrepreneurship.

H. General Structure of Semester III and Semester IV (i.e. Class XII):

1. In Semester III and Semester IV (i.e. Class XII), there will be two Language Papers (Subject 1 and Subject 2), two Vocational Papers (Subject 3 and Subject 4) and two compulsory Academic Elective Papers (Subject 5 and Subject 6). Also, there will be an Optional Paper (Subject 7). “Subject 7” may be chosen from the basket of the Academic Elective Papers of the respective discipline or from the Vocational Papers of the respective ‘Group’. “Subject 1” and “Subject 2” will be termed as “Language 1” and “Language 2” respectively. “Subject 3” and “Subject 4” will be termed as “Vocational Paper 1” (herein after referred to as ‘VP1’) and “Vocational Paper 2” (herein after referred to as ‘VP2’) respectively. “Subject 5” and “Subject 6”, will be termed as “Academic Elective 1” (herein after referred to as ‘AE1’) and “Academic Elective 2” (herein after referred to as ‘AE2’) respectively. “Subject 7”(if opted), will be referred as “Academic Elective 3” (herein after referred to as ‘AE3’), if chosen from the basket of the Academic Elective subjects. If “Subject 7” is chosen from the Vocational Papers of the respective ‘Group’, will be termed as “Vocational Paper 3” (herein after referred to as ‘VP3’). The general structure of Semester III and Semester IV is shown in “Table 5”.

I. Language Papers (Subject 1 and Subject 2) of Semester III and Semester IV (i.e. Class XII):

1. The choice of two language papers (Subject 1 and Subject 2) in Semester III and Semester IV (i.e. Class XII), remains unchanged for all the disciplines (shown in Table 4).

J. Vocational Papers (Subject 3 , Subject 4 and Subject 7) of Semester III and Semester IV (i.e. Class XII):

1. The choice of Vocational Papers i.e. ‘VP1’ , ‘VP2’ and ‘VP3’ (if chosen as optional paper) of all the ‘Groups’ under the five disciplines (AG, ET, BC, HS, HC), will have respective baskets of Vocational Subjects as mentioned below.

• Discipline: Agriculture (AG)

2. There will be five baskets of Vocational Papers for the respective ‘Groups’ of Agriculture discipline.

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- i) Vocational Subjects of Animal Husbandry (AGAH) Group: (a) DAIRY FARMING, (b) POULTRY FARMING, (c) ORNAMENTAL AVICULTURE, (d) ANIMAL HEALTHCARE
- ii) Vocational Subjects of Fisheries (AGFH) Group: (a) FISH SEED PRODUCTION, (b) AQUACULTURE, (c) ORNAMENTAL FISH CULTURE, (d) FISH PROCESSING AND IT'S WASTE UTILISATION

2. A candidate who fails to secure minimum thirty per centum marks independently in any one or two Academic Elective paper(s), will be given the following benefits.
 - i) One who fails to secure minimum thirty per centum marks in ‘Academic Elective 1’ but obtains more than thirty per centum marks in ‘Academic Elective 2’ and ‘Academic Elective 3’(if opted), will be given a benefit by replacing ‘Academic Elective 1’ with ‘Academic Elective 2’ and ‘Academic Elective 2’ with ‘Academic Elective 3’.

Note: This combination will continue in Class XII as well. Such candidate will not be allowed to opt for any new Academic Elective Paper. However, S/he may opt for one ‘Vocational Paper’ as ‘Optional Elective Paper’ if desired in Class XII.

- ii) One who fails to secure minimum thirty per centum marks in ‘Academic Elective 1’ and ‘Academic Elective 2’ independently, but obtains more than thirty per centum marks in ‘Academic Elective 3’, will be given a benefit by replacing ‘Academic Elective 1’ with ‘Academic Elective 3’.

Note: This combination will continue in Class XII as well. Such candidate will not be allowed to opt for any new Academic Elective Paper. However, S/he must compulsorily opt for one ‘Vocational Paper’ as ‘Optional Elective Paper’ in Class XII.

- iii) One who fails to secure minimum thirty per centum marks in ‘Academic Elective 1’ and ‘Academic Elective 3’, but obtains more than thirty per centum marks in ‘Academic Elective 2’, will be given a benefit by replacing ‘Academic Elective 1’ with ‘Academic Elective 2’.
